Nina Liu and Friends opens its doors for Charleston, SC's October Art Walk with *A Thousand Pounds of Clay*, an exhibition of work by gallery owner Nina Liu. The exhibition will open on Friday, Oct. 5 with a gallery reception for the artist from 5 to 7pm and will remain on view through Nov. 15, 2012.

Liu obtained her undergraduate degree from Wayne State University and her MFA from the University of Michigan. She has exhibited her work throughout the United States at venues such as Mepkin Abbey in Moncks Corner, SC; the Roanoke Museum of Fine Arts (now the Taubman Museum of Art) in Roanoke, VA; the Virginia Beach Arts Center in Virginia Beach, VA; the University of Iowa in Iowa City, IA; the Jacksonville Art Museum in Jacksonville, FL; and the Contemporary Arts Center in New Orleans, LA, Liu's work also is in numerous private and corporate collections. Collectors value Liu's work for the "weathered" surfaces, layered colors and intriguing patterns that she creates using a variety of clay bodies. Liu says that, now that the summer is ending and she is working with clay once more, she is "enjoying herself and doing some experiments" with the material. A Thousand Pounds of Clay will include low fired and stoneware bowls, plates and abstract constructions, with most of them being functional.

Other publications that have focused on Liu include the Post and Courier, Carolina Arts, Charleston magazine, and The New York Times, which has featured Liu and her gallery in at least two articles. These articles have addressed Liu's ceramics, her leadership within Charleston's arts community and her personal and business contributions to art and social services organizations in the area.

In 2011 the South Carolina Arts Commission presented Nina Liu and Friends with the Elizabeth O'Neill Verner Governor's Awards for the Arts, the highest honor the state presents in the arts, in the business category. The awards recognize outstanding achievement and contributions to the arts in the state. According to the South Carolina Arts Commission "these awards honor ... arts organizations, patrons, artists, members of the business community, and government entities who maximize their roles as innovators, supporters and advocates of the arts."
