Transition is a collection of photographs that demonstrate the artists' evolution from photographing un-posed nature to un-posed street images of both architecture and humans. Her work is a visual adventure, which engages the viewer with the subject matter, opens a dialogue, and leaves them with an understanding of the story that the photograph shares.

Schaefer grew up in Minnesota where she enjoyed photographing people. It wasn't until she moved to Seabrook Island in 1996, and found herself surrounded by nature and wildlife, that her interest in photography became a passion.
