The Art League of Hilton Head on Hilton Head Island, SC, will present *Elemental*, Artwork by Juliana Kim, on view in the Art League of Hilton Head Gallery, from Oct. 11 through Nov. 5, 2016. A reception will be held on Oct. 13, from 5-7pm.

Extensive travels have given Kim ample material to investigate the essence of space and place. When she moved from Boston to Hilton Head Island, she embraced her new environment by painting landscapes "en plein air". For this exhibition, she has taken 3 elements and explored her personal journey through them. "Water" has always been a concern, ecologically and aesthetically. "Air", with its dance of sunlight, atmosphere and color, has enthralled her. Earth-bound, the majestic "Live Oak" straddles both, reaching out for endurance and connection.

Kim's education includes extensive art history (Vassar) and studio art (School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston). She has had 20 solo exhibits and more than 45 group exhibits. Kim is an Exhibiting Artist at Art League of Hilton Head and has been

on its Board for 8 years. She is a member of SoBA, SC Watermedia Society and Lowcountry Plein Air Society.

The Bluffton Arts & Seafood Festival is back for the twelfth year – and still growing. What started as a one-day event in 2005, has quickly become a week of festivities in historic Bluffton, SC, showcasing the arts and locally harvested seafood. Festival events are scheduled from Saturday, Oct. 15 through Sunday, Oct., 23, 2016.

The traditional opening ceremony, the Blessing of the Fleet and Boat Parade on the May River, will again kick off this week of festivities at 4pm on Sunday, Oct. 16, preceded by a Showcase of Local Art, an outdoor art exhibit from 11am – 4pm in the heart of Old Town Bluffton, and finishing the day with the first Oyster Roast

of the season at Bluffton Oyster Park.

On Monday evening at 5:30pm a Tour of the Waddell Mariculture Center along with Crab Pickin' and Oyster Shuckin' demonstrations will take place with Dr. Al Stokes on the bluff of the Colleton River.

Wednesday, Oct. 19, again offers Author Night, from 5:30 – 8:30pm at the Rotary Community Center in Oscar Frazier Park,

Join us for an unforgettable evening of tribute to Beaufort's own Pat Conroy, the Lowcountry's greatest claim to literary fame. In conversation will be celebrated authors Cassandra King Conroy, Conroy's wife; Ellen Malphrus, Conroy's protégée; and Bernie Schein, Conroy's closest friend. This promises to be an exceptional opportunity for readers to engage with writers who were influenced by the renowned Conroy, not only as an author but also as a husband, mentor, and friend.

Cassandra King is the author of five novels, most recently the critically acclaimed *Moonrise* (2013), her literary homage to *Rebecca* by Daphne du Maurier. It has been described as "her finest book to date."

Ellen Malphrus lives and writes beside the May River in her native Carolina Lowcountry and beneath the Madison

Mountains in western Montana. She studied under esteemed poet and author of *Deliverance*, James Dickey, who was her mentor and Graduate Director for the MFA she earned at the University of South Carolina. She considers Pat Conroy, who wrote the foreword for *Untying the Moon*, her "brother-in-Dickey."

Born, bred and Bar Mitzvahed in Beaufort, SC, Bernie Schein graduated from Newberry College, Newberry, SC, and earned his Master's Degree in Education from Harvard University, Cambridge, MA. His most recent book prior to *Famous all over Town* (2014) is *If Holden Caulfield Were in My Classroom* (2009). His first book (co-authored with his wife psychologist Martha Schein), *Open Classrooms in the Middle School*, was a featured selection of the Educators' Book Club.
