Blowing Rock Frameworks & Gallery in Blowing Rock, NC, Offers Work by William "Wiili" Armstrong

Blowing Rock Frameworks & Gallery in Blowing Rock, NC, is presenting a fall show featuring Outsider artist, William "Wiili" Armstrong. well known in the High Country, and observed in *Folk Art Messenger* after his untimely death, Wiili was untrained and suffered from a number of mental illnesses, placing him categorically outside of the Art world as we know it. The exhibit will be on view through Nov. 30, 2017.

Outsider art focuses mainly on those who do not "belong" in the art world. Wiili did not "belong" anywhere. He spent much of his life homeless, after leaving home at the age of 17. His father was an ornithologist and shared much of his passion for birds with his son. Wiili, who was diagnosed bipolar and schizophrenic, found solitude along the outskirts of society and would trade paintings for money and coffee.

Wiili's work is characterized by bold brushstrokes and bright colors. He would paint on anything he could find, like cardboard or pieces of wood, ironing boards, hubcaps, turtle shells (yes, turtle shells!) and almost anything freely found. After he started selling more work, he had a bit of money to replenish his paints and actually buy canvas. He painted, used pastels, crayons, sculpted, anything he could find to let out the mental turmoil he felt.

Aesthetics aside, Wiili's subject matter remained consistent through most of his pieces. Being a nature lover, and with his

father's background in ornithology, Wiili's paintings usually feature at least one bird. He had quite the obsession with flying creatures. Angels mainly, also due to his love for women and the female form, butterflies, flying horses, etc. After studying so many of his paintings, these flight metaphors seem to be a cry for escape; almost as though he wanted to fly away from the mental distress of this existence.

huddled in a recessed doorway and painted one of my favorite works - a pasture and mountains partly obscured by a stormy sky. This moody, atmospheric painting suddenly opened my eyes to the unique beauty of North Carolina - quite different from Florida or the West - of fog rolling in and out, luminous sunsets, storms approaching, misty distant mountains, and huge banks of fat white clouds."

The transition to moody, atmospheric landscapes was not easy. "Atmospheric paintings require close values of dark and light and colorful grays; 'happy paintings' use strong contrasts of dark and light and bright color to capture the feel of sunny days," explained Pendergrass.

"I first tried various changes in paints by including one or more muted or unsaturated colors to mix the colorful grays of the atmospheric landscape. I then began to appreciate the need for careful control of values."

To control values, Pendergrass undertook monochrome underpaintings in burnt sienna as a base for the color painting. "I had instruction in how to do this early on, but did not understand why anyone would. It seemed a lot of preparation to get to the 'real' painting. I finally realized that it is easier to get values right without color, which saves time in correcting later on," says Pendergrass.

In addition to an opportunity to check composition before painting in color, she found that the underpainting cues proper color mixes - she holds a loaded brush of the color mix next to a value in the underpainting to match it.

"At this point, it is a pleasure to do the underpaintings, and I find them beautiful in themselves," Pendergrass enthuses. "The underpaintings alone have an atmospheric look- I sometimes hesitate to go on with color."

Pendergrass has had a lifelong love of color and design but took up painting as a second career. As a child, her art education consisted of many hours perusing her parents' book, *World-Famous Paintings* edited by Rockwell Kent. When she later committed to a career in art, she studied with nationally known painters Scott Christensen, CW Mundy, Greg Kreutz and Kenn Backhaus. Formal art education included courses at Old Lyme Art Academy in CT, as well as Crealde Art School and Seminole Community College, both in Orlando, FL.

Pendergrass' paintings have been selected for many regional and national art competitions, where she has received a number of awards for excellence.
