Corrigan Gallery LLC in Charleston, SC, is please to present for the Charleston Gallery Association Artwalk, the works of Nancy Langston in a show entitled *CAST*, on view at their new location on Broad Street from Oct. 4 - 30, 2017. The reception is Friday, Oct. 6, from 5-8pm.

Ancient, recovered remains - soul stirring and mythological pieces constructed of pate de verre - cast glass - concrete - turned to stone, these pieces look as though they have been excavated brought forth from the earth.

Langston holds a BA from VCU and a MFA from Massachusetts College of Art. She received an artist in residence fellowship for three months work at the Creative Glass Center of America in New Jersey, a Hubbard Traveling Grant and a scholarship from the Pilchuck School of Glass in Seattle. She has shown her work throughout the country and the Sandwich Glass

Museum and the Creative Glass Center of America Museum have creations of hers in their collections.

The artist states that, "glass, concrete, and metal(are) the media of choice for redesigning the earth. The shear abundance and everyday application of these materials relegates them to a low-level DIY Home Depot status. And herein lies their appeal to me. In my work, the concrete is sculpted to be graceful and elegant with the glass cast in a way that makes it mysterious and metaphoric."

"Searching to connect to a time and place undefined by buildings and roads, I merge these materials to create a recognizable yet undefined object - something earthy, ancient eroded, symbolic...feminine," adds Langston.
