## Newberry College in Newberry, SC, **Offers Works by Robert Matheson**

Newberry College in Newberry, SC, is presenting an exhibition of recent artworks by artist Robert Matheson, on view in the Wessel Gallery, through Oct. 31, 2019.

The exhibit covers work that Matheson has produced since moving to Newberry several months ago. The mediums that Matheson employs in the exhibit are diverse and range from photography to acrylic and mixed media to an installation piece created from a wooden display cabinet, stool, and wooden crates filled with a plethora of objects (mainly objects that local Newberrians have given to Matheson since his arrival).

The exhibit may appear to have a somewhat eclectic look until one reads the artist's statement describing how the concept for the show evolved. I suppose it's a southern charm thing, but often southerners will give gifts to a newly arrived citizen of their town or neighborhood and that is the case here. Matheson was given nearly all of the elements, objects, substrates, paint, etcetera, that he used to produce the works for the show.

The idea that guided Matheson through conceptualizing the show was to make use of as many of these gifts as he could in the production of the artwork. With that in mind, eclecticism is clearly and intentionally at the heart of the exhibition. Someone

gave him some linen milled in Newberry, he painted on it, someone gave him some eco-friendly acrylic paint, he painted with it, someone gave him some rocks that were collected on a vacation to Utah, he put them in the installation, the list of gifts goes on and they are accorded some contribution to the show.

Matheson's exhibition, apart from highlighting the work of a diverse and creative artist, brings to light the generosity of a small southern town - Newberry, SC.

The participating artists have samples of their work in the gallery, and patrons are encouraged to also visit the artists' studios throughout the community and the gallery in Tryon.

The gallery exhibition will be held from Oct. 4-18, and tours will be held for two days, Saturday, Oct. 5, 10am to 5pm, and Sunday, Oct. 6, noon to 5pm. The opening reception and start of the silent auction of participating artists' works will be Friday, Oct. 4, from 5-7:30pm.

There is no cost for patrons to see the exhibit or take the tours.
