home for over a century. About 40 lobster men remain through the winter braving the freezing temperatures and howling winds.

In her studio setting, Susan Altman works abstractly. However, on Monhegan, she paints and sketches outside, immersed in the island's natural beauty and charm. Her intuitive response is to gesturally express the essence of what the artist sees and feels in that magical moment on this tiny island.

Gallery 1056 presents the work of one or more Redux Studio Artists, and is curated by their fellow Redux Studio artists. The gallery is a "pay-it-forward" model that encourages artists to support each artist's personal artistic vision, while also providing a supportive atmosphere for collaboration between neighbors.

Born in 1958 in West Memphis, AR, Jamison became interested in art at an early age. He began taking classes as a means of learning how to capture the light and shadows that held his constant attention. His serious art studies began at Middle Tennessee State University in 1977. In 1982, Jamison enrolled at the Art Institute of Fort Lauderdale, FL. After two years, he graduated and was offered the position of Editorial Illustrator for the Fort Lauderdale Sun Sentinel newspaper. During this time, he also worked as a courtroom sketch artist in the Manuel Noriega trials in Miami. His award-winning illustrations began to fill national publications, including magazines and novel covers. Eventually deciding to convert to painting, Jamison utilizes his skill for drawing and scale combined with learned Old Master techniques and his own contempo-

I rary impressionistic creativity. He calls his process "controlled chaos." His awards and honors include: Oil Painters of America National Juried Exhibition of Traditional Oils – Award of Excellence (2009); Paint America Association's Paint the Parks Top 100 (2007); Oil Painters of America Eastern Regional Mini Show - Finalist (2007); Salon International Museum of Contemporary Masters - Third Place, Honorable Mention, and Jury Top 50 (2004, judged by Pino); National Park Services "Arts for the Parks" Competition - Mini Top 100 (2004); National "Paint Christopher Columbus" contest – Winner (1994).
