of just trying to hold yourself together. You have a closeup of a face with hands placed near the face in an act of frustration, but that is not the end of the story. The blue man is symbolic of both a silhouette and a mugshot. The face is in the position of the mugshot, but that does not mean there is guilt. The use of blue with the orange background challenges the viewer to consider oppositions and possibilities. There is an upward gaze that calls on hope as having the final word.


