experiences of the natural world.

Born in Kobe, Japan, Lawson came to the United States to study art after graduating from Mukogawa Women's University in Hyogo, Japan, with a degree in American Literature. She earned a Master of Fine Arts in Drawing & Painting from Illinois State University in 1988, then moved to Alabama to teach art at Auburn University. She relocated to South Carolina 22 years ago and has continued to teach fine art and design courses at a variety of colleges and universities.

Lawson is a member of the Charleston Artist Guild and her work has been shown in solo and group exhibitions throughout the southeast. She currently resides in Goose Creek, SC, and teaches Drawing, Design, and Color & Composition courses at Trident Technical College.

Mary Jane Nichols' exhibition, Greet ings from the South, features oil paintings on canvas and panel that serve as a reflection on growing up in the south. "After living in New York City for over a decade, I found myself thinking of a landscape as a vertical, blocky, compartmentalized space with only a suggestion of sky," she explains. She realized that it was only through recalling memories of her youth in Rock Hill, SC, and vacations away from the city that she was reminded of the joys in an unbroken landscape. Scenes from Nichols' hometown of Rock Hill are prevalent in the exhibition, as well as images from the surrounding counties and views from trips to the beach. "After completing this series, my recent decision to move back south was certainly made easier." she says. Nichols received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Hamilton College in Clinton, NY, in 2002 and studied portrait painting under Marvin Mattelson at the School

of Visual Arts in New York City from 2008-2010. For the majority of her artistic career she has mainly worked on commission, accomplishing a large number of oil paintings for private clients. Nichols sites The Hudson River School of painters as the greatest visual influence on her work, and aims to juxtapose a harmonious relationship between humans and nature in her paintings while capturing the awe-inspiring beauty of America. After 11 years, Nichols recently left New York City for Charlottesville, VA, where she now lives and works. The North Charleston City Gallery is situated in the common areas of the Charleston Area Convention Center, located on Coliseum Drive in North Charleston. Parking and admission are free during regular Convention Center operating hours.
