She works in a range of 2-dimensional media that includes acrylic, oil, pencil, and pastel on paper, panel, or canvas.








rent work, she refers to the philosophy of Art as: art reflects nature and nature reflects art. Pesce has worked in a variety of media and produces photographs, functional ceramics, sculptures, and primitives. Her current work focuses on the art of Zentangle.

The Zentangle method is based on the act of drawing pattern and filling those patterns in with more pattern. It has been used by people as a form of self-help art therapy due to the meditative quality of sketching repeating designs. While some Zentangle artists use colors, this method traditionally sticks to black ink. It allows the artist to focus on the patterns instead of color composition. Pesce's Zentangle patterns often reflect her love of nature and sea life.

Colleen McGhee was born and raised in Greenwood and grew up attending the local public schools. She graduated from
