Lowcountry Artists Gallery in Charleston, SC, Offers Exhibition Focused on Sweetgrass Traditions

Lowcountry Artists Gallery in Charleston, SC, will present a group exhibition honoring sweetgrass traditions to celebrate the generations who have preserved this unique Lowcountry art form, on view from Nov. 1 - 30, 2020. A reception will be held on Nov. 6, from 5-8pm.

Lowcountry Artists Gallery will feature basketry created by sweetgrass artist Marie Wine, sweetgrass tables by Pete Rock, watercolors by Sandra Roper, and oil paintings by Norma Morris Cable. These artists have come together in a group show focused on the colorful and varied culture of one of America's oldest and most important African inspired arts.

The African cultural heritage sweetgrass basket weaving was brought to South Carolina in the late 17th century by enslaved African people and was used in rice and

cotton production. The craft requires much patience and creativity and has been handed down from generation to generation.

Marie Wine, a local sweetgrass basket artist, creates one-of-a-kind treasures that are not only beautiful but useful. She was taught the tradition by her Mother, and she has been sewing her baskets from the time she was six years old. Wine's stitches are tightly and expertly woven to create pleasing designs. Passing on the tradition is important to her, and her daughter has also mastered the vanishing craft. Hopefully, grandchildren will continue to pass on the centuries-old tradition.

Pete Rock is a long-time native of Charleston, raised on the Isle of Palms and currently living in Mount Pleasant. He spent his early years working in construc-
