The gallery located at 210 Main Street, represents over 50 local piedmont artists and is open Mon.-Sat., from 10am to 6pm. Owner Laura Bachinski, a professional potter and art collector, saw a need for a gallery dedicated to local art.

"The art community in Greenwood is continuing to grow and evolve as more people move to the area. The Greenwood Arts Center hosts local, regional and national exhibits, and Lander University Art Department is very involved in the local community and music and dining opportunities are abundant. The time was right for opening a shop that would give local artists and craftspeople a venue to sell and exhibit work," said Bachinski.

The 2,300-square foot gallery and retail space located in a restored bank building is filled with a myriad of art and handcrafted gifts. Pottery, sculptures, photography, paintings, fiber art, jewelry, wood art, paper art and handmade books are among the items available for purchase.

The gallery offers memberships to

artists that produce quality work in a variety of media. Artists are invited to apply for membership or may apply on their own by contacting the gallery staff and completing the application process. Artists pay a monthly fee that gives them the opportunity to be represented by the gallery in the online shopping store that the gallery manages for them. The gallery holds monthly events and receptions for its member artists and will be conducting workshops in a variety of media beginning in the spring. In addition, member artists are eligible to apply for Main & Maxwell's exclusive granting program.

The Arts Center of Greenwood, at the Federal Building, at 120 Main Street in Uptown, is currently hosting the Annual Multi-Guild Exhibition and Sale, featuring local, award-winning artwork from area artists who belong to local guilds. The Christmas Village, located in a special room downstairs at the Museum, was featured at the Holiday Open House this year and is open to the public Wed. Sat., from 10am-5pm, until Dec. 22.

Lander University in Greenwood is presenting an exhibit of works by graduating Senior art students, on view in the Monsanto Gallery, located in the Josephine B. Abney Cultural Center, through Dec. 14, 2016. Gallery hours are Mon. & Wed., 10am-7pm; Tue. & Thur., 10am-6pm; and Fri., 10am-noon.

The Council of Lakelands Area Woodworkers was formed in 1999 to promote education and foster craftsmanship in the art and techniques of woodworking. The club meets on the third Saturday of each month. Meetings are held at UCCC/Blake School, in Greenwood, SC.

The Lakelands Basketry Guild was founded in 2006. Their goals include learning and teaching basketry techniques, experimenting with different materials. sharing skills with each other, and supporting each other to become better weavers. The Guild meets the third Saturday of each month at the historic Chappells Community Center in Chappells, SC.
