This year, the judge will be Hollis Hammonds whose drawings are currently on exhibit in the Cecelia Coker Bell Gallery. Hammonds will select all the art, assign place, and award prizes that have been donated by art manufacturers and suppliers. The judges for these shows are always given free reign regarding a show's size and focus, and the resulting shows have ranged from large and inclusive to small, theme-oriented exhibitions. The selection process has always served as a stimulus for critical discussion.

Hammonds received her BFA in Drawing from Northern Kentucky University and her MFA in 2D Studies from the University of Cincinnati. She is the author of Drawing Structure: Conceptual and Observational Techniques, and has had her creative work featured in multiple publications. She was awarded the grand

prize for the Dave Bown Projects 14th Semi Annual Competition, and has been an artist in residence at McColl Center for Art + Innovation in Charlotte, NC, Vermont Studio Center, and Atlantic Center for the Arts. Hammonds is an Associate Professor of Art and Chair of the Department of Visual Studies at St. Edward's University in Austin, TX.

Fine Art at Baxters in New Bern, NC, is presenting *The Everyday World*, featuring works by Eric McRay, on view through Dec. 29, 2017.

McRay's Guiding Principle - An artist's style is his visual language by which he communicates. Thus, McRay is multilingual. Openness and exploration rather than a dedication to a particular style best characterize his work. "I believe there is no single correct pictorial solution."

McRay received a BFA degree at the Maryland Institute, College of Art, where he earned a four-year scholarship for his artistic talent. A native of Washington, DC, McRay moved to North Carolina and has been exhibiting since 1987. In November 1998, he was juried into Raleigh's prestigious Artspace. Since opening his Artspace studio in downtown Raleigh, McRay has served in the offices of Vice-President and President of the Artspace Artists Association, as well as served on Artspace's board of directors and Executive Committee.
