of sales, but also by the exhibition's ability to promote an awareness of the quality of work being produced by North Carolina artists. This year's exhibition includes exciting new talents and well-known artists who continue to evolve in their creative practice. It is a show that must be visited early on, before early pick-up of sold works." Thirtytwo artists are returning, including John Gaitenby, Kate Long Stevenson, Juie Rattley, Ben Owen, Steven Forbes-de-Soule, Ken Carder and Janet Taylor. New artists, Bryan M. Wilson, Lola Santos, Homer Samuel Wade, Rosalie Midvette, Anna Johnson and Lee Sipe embody the creative ferment of the North Carolina art scene.

On Dec. 1, 2018, from 7-11pm, *Winter Show* is kicked off with Collector's Choice, GreenHill's annual fundraiser and preview party. With over half of the participating artists in attendance, Collector's Choice is an opportunity to not only view the work but engage with the artists in the exhibition. 


