Please join the Department of Visual and Performing Arts at the Greer, SC, campus of Greenville Technical College for *Seconds: Works by Daniel Marinelli*, an exhibition new works by Greenville artist Daniel Marinelli, on view through Feb. 22, 2013.

Moving freely between the mediums of painting and sculpture, Marinelli's work examines ordinary mechanical objects as a means of creating a precisionist vocabulary expressed in steel, paint, paper, and wood. Marinelli's surfaces employ both additive and reductive methods, resulting in subtle shifts that speak to philosophical questions of presence and absence.

Winthrop University in Rock Hill, SC, will present *Sonya Clark: Material Reflex*, on view in the Rutledge Gallery, from Feb. 4 through Mar. 8, 2013. Clark will offer an artist talk on Feb. 21, beginning at 8pm in 119 Rutledge Building. Showing simultaneously from Feb. 4 through Mar. 8, 2013, in the Elizabeth Dunlap Patrick Gallery is Canadian artist Christine Kirouac's exhibition *Siren Fall*. A reception will be held for both exhibit on Feb. 8, from 6:30-8pm.

These new exhibits conclude a yearlong exploration of the textile industry at Winthrop Galleries who partnered with the Craft and Folk Art Museum in Los Angeles to present *Sonya Clark: Material Reflex*.
