Yet the chair constrains as well, with its subtle imperative not to rise but to "stay seated."

empty chair can serve as a reminder of solitude and loss in its haunting vacancy.

This five person exhibition presents the chair as an object that transcends its utilitarian function as a seat in order to serve as an impetus to conversations about inclusions, constraints, place, and time. Janet Kozachek, Kim Ledee, Janet Orselli, Lee Malerich, and Nathaniel Wallace, use their artistic visions and technical skills to bring to life their own personal interpretations of this common object along with its philosophical and ethical significance.
