

The Artists' Guild of Spartanburg in Spartanburg, SC, will present the exhibit, Head Shots, featuring a series of 8 by 10inch paintings of friends and family by Dorothy Chapman Josey, on view in the Guild Gallery located at the Chapman Cultural Center from Apr. 1 - 28, 2012. A reception will be held on Apr. 19, from 5:30-9pm. Josey will give an artist's talk at 6:30pm.

Josey's portraits hang at Wofford College, USC-Upstate, Gibbs Cancer Center at Spartanburg Regional Medical Center, the Episcopal Church of the Advent, and in many private homes in the area. However, she considers these new and smaller works to be paintings rather than portraits. They allow her more freedom of expression, while at the same time maintaining a likeness of the subject. Josey considers being able to paint a likeness a gift that she has developed over the years.

Rosemary McLeod's work in this exhibit will showcase various jewelry mediums such as sterling, copper, leather, and silk. She used inspiration from pantone's spring 2012 color forecast.

McLeod is a self-taught jewelry artisan. Starting in the summer of 2006, as a favor from a friend, she took a class at a local craft store. Since then, she has taken several courses in making jewelry such as cold connections, wirework, metal fabrication, silversmithing and is PMC [Precious Metal Clay certified.

In 2007, McLeod started her business, McRose Designs. Her work is currently for sale at The Spartanburg Library Gift Shop, LC Art Gallery, West Main Artists Co-op Gallery Shop The ART LOUNGE and recently, Green Springs Gift Shop in Seneca, SC. Her gallery memberships include West Main Artists Co-operative, Artists' Guild of Spartanburg, Tryon Arts & Crafts, and Metropolitan Arts Council in Greenville, SC.

In the Fall of 2010, McLeod got accepted into her first juried show at Carolina Foothills Artisan Center in Chesnee, SC. In February 2011, her jewelry piece was accepted in the Multi-Cultural Juried Exhibit sponsored by the Artists' Guild of Spartanburg.
