Claudia Dunaway has been a potter for 40 years, and it shows in the intricate details and pure craftsmanship of her work. This Reidsville, NC, native and UNC-G graduate has traveled and gained inspiration from all over, but now fires up her kiln at the Yummy Mud Puddle Studios in Burnsville, NC.

The Yummy Mud Puddle sits atop 10 acres of majestic forest in an area filled with creative spirit and professional crafts people that influence Dunaway's work. Pops of colors interlaced with the muted earth tones typical of her work, give each piece of art depth and variation. The vintage sci-fi rocket ships, robots, and alien women, all original drawings by John and Claudia, are made into underglaze silkscreen printed images that are transferred to the surface of each piece. The images are fired onto the work and are permanent. All of Dunaway's work is intended for use with glazes that are food safe as well as dishwasher and microwave safe. 
