COCO VIVO Art for Living in Charleston, SC, Features Works by Mitch Billis

COCO VIVO Art for Living in Charleston, SC, will present *Mitch Billis Solo Show*, featuring more than a dozen extraordinary paintings by our most recognized and nationally renowned artist, Mitch Billis, on view from Apr. 1 - 30, 2014. A reception will be held on Apr. 4, from 5-8pm.

This is the first 2014 exhibition to highlight the work of Billis, a member of Who's Who in American Art. Most are never-before-seen pieces that capture the artist's personal styles of light casting shadows in romanticize views of the Lowcountry and Italy.

The show was organized by Mary Phelps. Created especially for this exhibition, this solo presentation features oil paintings depicting coastal nautical scenes, Italian and Lowcountry architecture, and coastal marshes.

Boothbay Harbor, ME, artist Mitch Billis loves to paint Charleston, Maine, and Italy. In all places, he finds the flower-draped porches, snug harbors, and time-worn buildings that attract his keen eye. Billis sees life as a continuum of learning, "If you are being honest about what and how you paint,

learning to see keeps on forever. I am still learning. That's the joy and frustration of painting. I am constantly experimenting and trying to improve the quality of my work. Sometimes a step back can mean two steps forward. Other times it's just a step back, but the inherent struggle always leads in new directions. As Robert Henri says in *The Art Spirit*, "Painting is about the process, that's where the joy lies." The paintings are merely a by-product of the life I have been privileged to lead." His own life is testimony to this idea of continual learning.

In recent months, Jordahl has been preoccupied with Spring. During this seemingly endless and harsh winter, she has been pondering the beautiful aspects of Spring's renewal process: the rebirth of animals, the blooming of flowers that bring delicate green, yellow and pink hues of new leaves, buds and grasses that transform the drab and

dirty winter landscape. She has put together a collection of paintings knitted together by the theme of renewal that is undeniable in May in Charleston.

Jordahl, originally from the midwest state of Iowa, earned a bachelor's degree in advertising which brought her to the south working on accounts as varied as the 1996 Summer Olympics, the US Marine Corps and Norfolk Southern Railroad. It was after the birth of her children that she pursued a career in fine arts. Her work is identifiable by its rich texture of thick oil paint and her use of color in interpreting her subject matter.

Jordahl lives and works in Charleston. Her artwork is represented in private collections nationally and internationally as well as in corporate collections. She is the current President of Lowcountry Artists Ltd. gallery.

Surrounded by creativity and art throughout his childhood, Robb Helmkamp was encouraged to explore his imagination and delve wholeheartedly into his interests. His mother, painter and lifetime potter, Marty Biernbaum, has always been a wealth of inspiration, providing he and his brother freedom which led them to each become artists in their own sculptural medium and master craftsmen. The creative energy within a family of artists is unparalleled and with this encouragement Helmkamp has been making and designing furniture for over 10 years.
