and performing artists. Its large auditorium, "The Venue", formerly the church sanctuary, has recently been renovated into a beautiful space that may be rented for special occasions and features specially constructed movable walls that can be reconfigured in various ways for exhibition, performance or reception space. In addition to galleries and individual studio spaces, it houses common use areas, including a large pottery studio, printery, silk screen area, and workshop area.

Lander University in Greenwood, SC, Offers Works by Logan Woodle

Lander University in Greenwood, SC, is presenting *Heirloom*, a solo exhibit by Logan Woodle, on view in the Jackson Library, through May 2, 2015.

Logan Woodle is Assistant Professor of Art at Coastal Carolina University, in Conway, SC. He earned his BFA from Winthrop University and his MFA from Edinboro University of Pennsylvania concentrating in jewelry and metalsmithing. Woodle is an award-winning artist who exhibits widely across the country.

Woodle says of his work, "I awake hearing the rumblings of a grandfather a lifetime away, I see the fingerprints of a woman long dead on my breakfast, and I work to the rhythmic footsteps of a man plowing fields half a century ago. I cannot define myself except in their words. My relationship to this mythology is that of a mule to its yoke. This mythology binds and burdens me, yet it allows me the confidence of definite path. My work addresses these blessed burdens; it

permits me to understand my own compulsions and to give permanence to all the things I find are too easily forgotten and yet impossible to live without."

"The resulting sculptural work combines humor, history and personal heritage in functional objects," adds Woodle. "These narrative driven works revel in a celebration of high craftsmanship and composition".
