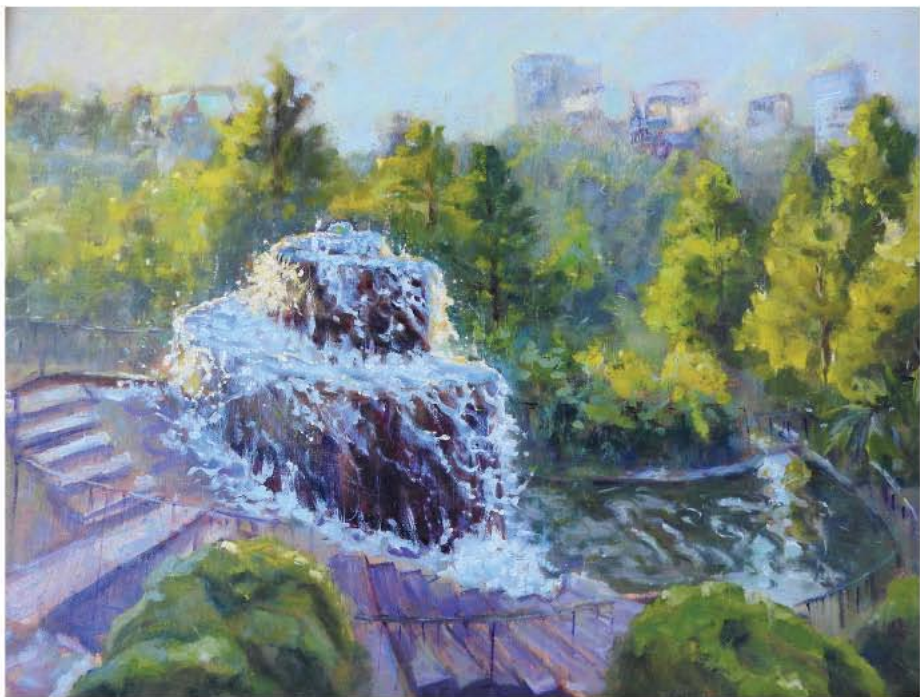
USC in Columbia, SC, Offers Works by Stephanie Shively
