

1930's have influenced Colleen Ringrose's new body of work. Like Connolly she is a "digger" finding her images in old and discarded books. The inspiration for these new paintings comes from an unlikely source, a book for stamp collectors from 1936. Originally thinking it would be the stamps that would inspire her new work, it was the pictures of the watermarks in the paper used to authenticate the stamps from around the world that caught her eye. The watermark is a thin place in the paper and can only be seen by turning the stamp over and washing it with Benzene. Only then will these small designs appear. In Ringrose's new paintings she presents them as modern icons set off by the explosions of color. This work is part ancient wax painting and part computer technology. These paintings juxtapose the fluid colorful textures created by the encaustic wax and the more formal graphic quality of the watermarks. Blowing up the watermarks allows for a closer look at what is invisible in daily life.



Franklin G. Burroughs-Simeon B. Chapin Art Museum in Myrtle Beach, NC, Offers Works by Waccamaw Arts & Crafts Guild

Over forty artists from around the region will vie for top nonors and over 320cash prizes in the Fifteenth Annual Waccamaw Arts & Crafts Guild Juried Exhibition, opening Thursday, May 3, 2012, at the Franklin G. Burroughs-Simeon B. Chapin Art Museum in Myrtle Beach, SC. A reception will be held from 5:30 to 7:30pm, with an awards presentations beginning at 6pm. The exhibit continues through May 24, 2012. Up to 70 two-dimensional and threedimensional works will be selected for jurying. Works selected for display include oil, watercolor, and mixed media paintings; photographs; wood and clay sculptures; and an array of craft items such as batik, quilts and fiber arts. With creations from artists throughout the Carolinas, the show is a perennially popular event with locals and visitors. A large percentage of the works on display will also be available for purchase. Judge and juror for this year's competition is Jacqueline Balog, a North Carolina artist, an educator and a member of the Fuquay-Varina Art Guild, the Colored Pencil Society of American and the Colored Pencil Society of Raleigh, NC.

621N4Th Gallery in Wilmington, NC, Features Works by Michelle Connolly and Colleen Ringrose

621N4Th Gallery in Wilmington, NC, is presenting the exhibit, *Connolly-Ringrose*, featuring works by Michelle Connolly and Colleen Ringrose, on view through May 25, 2012.

In the new body of work by Michelle Connolly, encouraged by Colleen Ringrose, she has explored a different medium: encaustic. To her, encaustic paint is just another tool in her ever expanding bag of tricks, just another way to express the potential she sees in the discarded material she salvages. For Connolly paintings come fast and furiously. Through play and "digging" she creates layers, textures and personalities from old metal scraps and found treasures. The raw materials often speak to her and lead the way to genuine and courageous bodies of work. The paintings and assemblages' achieve exciting balances between the figurative and pure abstractions. Just enough information is given, but not so much as to kill the spontaneity and personality of the figures.

Cash awards to be given include the \$800 Rebecca R. Bryan Best in Show Award, as well as First, Second and Third Place awards of \$500, \$275 and \$100 respectively. An additional 10 works will also be selected for Honorable Mentions.
