Gibbes since 2003, where she manages the museum's permanent collection and oversees museum operations as well as logistics for its active exhibition and loan programs.

Prior to working at the Gibbes, Willits served as Registrar for the Augusta Museum of History and Assistant Registrar for the Michael C. Carlos Museum at Emory University. She is Immediate Past President of the South Carolina Federation of Museums, Vice President of the Southeastern Museums Conference, an appointed member of the 2018 National Program Committee of the American Alliance of Museums, and a Peer Reviewer for the Museum Assessment Program (in the area of Collections Stewardship.)

Willits has been fortunate to work closely with local, regional, and nationally-known artists as well as with private & public collections over the course of her career at the Gibbes. Her experiences related to movement and installation of artwork are often directly connected to the nuances of a particular "process" an artist has employed giving her a unique perspective on the various qualities of all mediums of artwork.

The 2018 Judged Photography Competition & Exhibition, features works by artists from throughout SC, competing for cash awards in two categories totaling \$1,450. Categories include color and monochrome. Awards will be at the sole discretion of the judge, David "Sully" Sullivan. City of North Charleston, SC, Features Installation by Heather Thornton and Sage Graham

The City of North Charleston, SC, will present *False Dichotomy*, an immerisve art installation by Heather Thornton and Sage Graham, on view at the Historic Reynolds Avenue Fire Station, from May 4 through June 3, 2018.

Using a mix of traditional sculpture media and donated materials, discarded items, and found objects, local artists Sage Graham and Heather Thornton have transformed the engine bays of a vacant fire station into an immersive art installation. Their collaboration is inspired by the two hemispheres of the brain; one responsible for creativity and the other for logic.

Approaching the space as two separate yet connected rooms, the artists aim to explore the concepts of duality, conflict, harmony, and choice. A figure emerges from each room appearing to approach one another and creating a path of texture in their wake. These sculptural elements

are accompanied by a video projection, creating a multi-media experience.

False Dichotomy is Graham and Thornton's first major collaborative work. Having known each other since high school in Myrtle Beach, the artists recently reconnected after graduating from the College of Charleston. The similar themes and ideas in their individual works made them natural collaborators.

Graham focuses in sculpture, performance art, and puppetry, creating narratives about identity, psychology, and the effects of the world on the individual.

Thornton creates oil paintings, and more recently collage works, portraying figurative realism with a focus on identity, spirituality, and the psyche.
