variety of reasons, including fear of retaliation, home or family situations, and distrust or skepticism in the police. Safe spaces, such as Promise Place and the Coastal Women's Shelter, provide victims resources and a community where they can speak, heal, and grow from these traumatic crimes.

The goal of the *Paint a Mile* exhibition and "Walk a Mile" event are to raise awareness around these issues, and support the organizations actively working to help victims. Artists Brian Cardoza, Dara Morgan, Se'rah Cheatham, Andrew Craddock, and

more have contributed original works on the topic of sexual assault and the experience of healing from it. Proceeds from the sale of work will go to benefit Promise Place and Coastal Women's Shelter. Visitors can also compose their own "6 word stories" to add to the exhibition addressing the topics or paintings and post them to the wall under the works.

24 South Coffeehouse in Wilmington, NC, is presenting Heather Divoky's first show as a full-time artist, on view through May 31, 2019. The show is titled *Ephemeri*des and will feature all new work in marker, ink, and wire.

Divoky's newest body of work is an exploration between the scientific and the fantastical. Astrology and astronomy were once two sides of the same coin. Her work tries to bring them back together. Ephemerides were books used to track celestial bodies in both disciplines. By focusing on the 12 Zodiacs, Divoky offers a perspective on what the signs really mean - if they really mean anything at all. At the same time, the Zodiacs are constellations in the night sky. In illustrating these constellations and creating tiny star ornaments, Divoky hopes the viewer will take a second to ponder the juxtaposition of the extravagant with everyday science.

Divoky is an artist working in Wilmington, NC. She obtained her Masters in Arts and Culture at Leiden University, the Netherlands. She has worked in the arts as a creator, curator, historian, designer, and administrator. Her award-winning work has been show nationally and internationally, from Nashville to Amsterdam. Divoky's
