Farrell, a native of Charleston, SC, is a graduate of Duke University. She also holds two master's degrees from the University of South Carolina, one in studio art. She has worked in watercolors and oils as well as printmaking; many of her works are landscapes. While studying in Italy in 2002, Farrell was introduced to Solarplate etching, a method using opaque paint or ink to create an image on transparent acetate, mylar, Xerox or a glass surface. This "transparency" is used as a contact, either positive or negative, for either intaglio or relief printing. By converting a drawing or painting to a digital image, Farrell creates what she calls photo etchings that she then incorporates into her monotypes.

"I find that the challenge of doing something new, coupled with efforts at experimentation, are giving me a new attitude about art and a new pleasure in creating it," Farrell writes in her artist's statement.

Works in the A is for Art series were all created within the last few years.

Farrell's works have received "best in show" awards in competitions including the San Diego Watercolor Society Exhibit, the Friends of the Coast (Charleston), the Waccamaw Arts & Crafts Guild Juried Exhibition, and the University of South Carolina Alumni Art Competition. Her work is included in corporate and private collections nationwide.

A is for Art runs concurrently with Ansel Adams: Classic Images. Admission to the Art Museum is free at all times, but dona-

## Brookgreen Gardens in Murrells Inlet, SC, Features Works by Kent Ullberg



including pedestal-sized sculptures organized by David J. Wagner, Ph.D., an independent curator. Wagner writes, "As a sculptor at the vanguard of postmodern art, Ullberg employs his deep knowledge of nature and his exceptional skill and talent to create works that endure."

"The full evolution of Kent Ullberg's subject matter is reflected in sculptures selected for the exhibition," said Robin Salmon, Vice-President of Art and Historical Collections and Curator of Sculpture at Brookgreen Gardens. "The works give insight into his sense of design and mechanics and also include smaller sculptures of unique and delicate beauty."

The pieces, cast in bronze and stainless steel, cover a 40-year period from 1969 (Owl) to 2009 (Halcyon). Additional works in the exhibition are Wind in the Sails, a 1999 stainless steel sculpture that stands in Stockholm, Sweden, and the maquette for Sailfish in Three Stages of Ascending, a monumental sculpture located in Fort Lauderdale, FL.

Ullberg has lived throughout the world pursuing his career as a naturalist, museum curator, and sculptor. He currently divides his time between his homes and studios in Corpus Christi, TX, and Loveland, CO.

Ullberg is a member of many prestigious American art organizations including the National Academy of Design, National Sculpture Society, Society of Animal Artists, National Arts Club, Allied

Artists of America, American Society of Marine Artists, National Academy of Western Art, and the Society for Wildlife Art of the Nations in Sandhurst, England.

Brookgreen Gardens' visitors have enjoyed Ullberg's work for many years – his Ring of Bright Water, a delightful circle of swimming otters, stands next to Jessamine
