of paint to upwards of 12 layers of paint, as well as sculpture and assemblage."

Richards, born in 1977, attended UNC-Wilmington, where he earned a BA in Art in 1999. In 2003, he enrolled in SUNY Empire State College as a non-matriculated graduate student. This MSLA program afforded him a studio in Manhattan with weekly studio visits and critiques from established artists, critics, and curators. Richards left NYC in the spring of 2006, returning to North Carolina to pursue art full time. He moved to Raleigh, NC, in August 2006, and in January 2007 he was awarded the Regional Emerging Artist Residency at Artspace.

In November 2007, he was included in his first museum show, *The Human Scale*, at the Cameron Museum in Wilmington, NC. Richards was awarded 3-month residency at The Bemis Center of Contemporary Arts in Omaha, NE, for October-December 2009. He was the recipient of The Target Gallery's open call Solo Exhibition in October 2010, in Alexandria, VA.

In 2011 Richards had solo shows at the Greenhill Center for NC Art, and Flanders Art Gallery. In 2012, he was included in a group exhibition at the North Carolina Museum of Art, titled *Word Up: the Intersection of Text and Image*. In 2014 he exhibited at The Center for Visual Arts, and at Coker College. In 2015 he formed Peregrine Projects, an artist co-op that works with business to promote local artists through Public Art, and short-term exhibitions. Richards continues to reside and hold studio space in Raleigh.
