The Craven Arts Council in New Bern, NC, offers Fusion Poetry: Art, featuring works of local art inspired by local poetry, on view in the Council's Main and Director's Galleries at Bank of the Arts, through June 30, 2018. A reception for the exhibit will be held during the Downtown New Bern Artwalk, June 8, from 5-8pm.
