#### Artist for Feed the Need Auction Results

The organizers of the Artist for Feed the Need had set a goal of raising \$20,000 from their art auction to help the local food industry, help feed people in need. Almost 100 artists from the Lowcountry of SC, donated their work to this auction and the final results were - they raised \$67,029.00. Way to go artists, now here's a way to help yourselves out during this pandemic.

#### Artists From Around the World Help Other Artists by Taking the Artist Support Pledge

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many artists have found themselves without work, teaching, technical support and gallery work. Exhibitions and sales have disappeared. In an attempt to help alleviate some of this stress artists around the world are taking the ARTIST SUPPORT PLEDGE #artistsupportpledge

The concept is a simple one started by British artist, Matthew Burrows. Artists post images of their work, on Instagram or Facebook which they are willing to sell for no more than \$200 each (not including shipping). Anyone can buy the work. Every time an artist reaches \$1,000 of sales, they pledge to spend \$200 on another artist's work.

Some frequently asked questions include: I WANT TO SELL MY ART. CAN I TAKE PART?

Yes. Anyone can take part from anywhere in the world. This is a global movement and works best when we stay united.

I WANT TO BUY ART. CAN ANY-ONE? Yes. Anyone can take part. This is open to

Yes. Anyone can take part. This is open to everyone, everywhere around the world. HOW DO I TAKE PART?

Artists post images of their work on Instagram with the #artistsupportpledge, with details and price. If people are interested in buying, they message (DM) the artist.

Matthew Burrows started the Artist Support Pledge initiative to alleviate some of the stress the pandemic has caused, as many artists have now found themselves without work. Exhibitions and sales have been shut down, and teaching and technical support has become difficult to access. The project, which he launched on his Instagram page, "was really a response to the current situation, a creative solution to how I might help myself but also friends and colleagues through this period, by utilizing the generosity of the arts community—which is abundant," says Burrows.

friends, family, students, and collectors, I've been able to pay-it-forward six (working on 7) times. That has put \$1,200 back into the artist community," says Keane.

Most of the activity surrounding the Artist Support Pledge is taking place on Instagram, but since a lot of folks don't use Instagram, but are on Facebook, we have tried to include info about how you can participate as an artist or art buyer on Facebook.

A new Facebook group page is being set up for artists who live in the Carolinas and are participating in the Artist Support Pledge. The page was set up by Charleston, SC, artist, Susan Irish, with technical help from Jen Ashley, who works on a digital newsletter in Charleston called CHStoday. It's just starting so it will take time before artwork starts to show up.
