701 Center for Contemporary Art in Columbia, SC, Features Works by Janke Klompmaker

For its Summer 2016 exhibition, 701 Center for Contemporary Art in Columbia, SC, is presenting works by Dutch artist Janke Klompmaker, the center's current artist in residence, on view through Aug. 14, 2016. For her exhibition, Klompmaker will create a gallery wide installation called *Shelter*. At the end of the exhibition, on Sunday, Aug. 14, sculptural objects in the exhibitions will be sold at a public auction.

Through *Shelter*, Klompmaker addresses the Syrian refuge crisis in the United States and Europe, including her home country, The Netherlands. The artist will create two large shelters with grass floors. The shelters will be surrounded by ritualistic and symbolic offerings – all objects made of paper. The objects include small houses, pod- and cocoon-like objects, small bowls, larger bowls with beans or rice and cooking pots with lids, Klompmaker invites viewers to rest, take off their shoes and socks, walk into the shelters and contemplate the complexities of accepting or rejecting strangers in our midst.

"Worldwide, the number of displaced people is growing, as is the challenge to care for them," Klompmaker says. "It's hard to come to terms with potential cultural conflicts or the economic and social ramifications of opening borders. Shelter suggests that Mother Earth does not differentiate between people; the feeling and scent of the grass under our feet is the same for every human. Perhaps the shelters represent the dream of a warm and welcoming world, of Utopia."

Klompmaker (born 1944, The Netherlands) has been in residence at 701 CCA since April 1, when she arrived from her hometown of Groningen in The Netherlands. The artist first conducted lantern-making workshops for Columbia residents, then led a large lantern parade during this year's Artista Vista. The

parade was among the highlights of the event. During the rest of her stay, Klompmaker has been creating the objects that will be part of her exhibition, *Shelter*.

Klompmaker came to making art later in life, completing her studio art degree when she was in her mid fifties, after a career as a secretary. She has had solo exhibitions in The Netherlands, Spain and the United States, including at the Helene Wurlitzer Foundation in Taos, NM, and Furman University in Greenville, SC. Klompmaker also completed residencies in Taos and Greenville. She has had several residencies in Spain.

701 CCA is a non-profit visual arts center that promotes understanding, appreciation and enjoyment of contemporary art, the creative process and the role of art and artists in the community. The center also encourages interaction between visual and other art forms.
