The Morris Center for Lowcountry Heritage in Ridgeland, SC, will present The Great Charleston Earthquake of 1886 Exhibition, on view from July 1 through Nov. 2, 2019.

This exhibit examines the most destructive earthquake ever recorded in the eastern United States. The quake occurred near Charleston, SC, on Aug. 31, 1886. The quake was felt by two out every three people living in the country! Estimated at a 7.3 magnitude (more powerful than the Haiti earthquake in 2010) the shock lasted about a minute.

More than 100 people were killed and almost every building in Charleston was damaged. Charlestonians suffered the most psychologically given the 300 aftershocks taking place over the next 3 years.

The earthquake triggered many strange afflictions, even in cities far from the epicenter. According to the Savannah Morning News, at least a dozen people went insane and had to be sent to lunatic asylums, including "the wives and daughters of prominent citizens." clerk started walking on Tuesday night and didn't stop until he reached a town fifty miles away, where he sent a postcard to his parents saying he could not return."

Within days almost everyone in Charleston abandoned his damaged home to sleep outside, in parks, cemeteries, backyards, on buses, ships, ice wagons, and railroad cars. Ships in the harbor became refugees for the homeless. By Sept. 3, 40,000 people were tenting and continued on Page 9
