Artworks Gallery in Winston-Salem, NC, Features Works by Seth Moskowitz and Don Green

Artworks Gallery in Winston-Salem, NC, is presenting OH! Naturale - Nudes and Nature, featuring works by Seth Moskowitz and Don Green, on view through Aug. 26, 2017. Receptions will be held on Aug. 4, from 7-10pm and Aug. 6, from 2-4pm.

Seth Moskowitz has always been fascinated by the beauty of organic forms and how shifts in the interplay of hue, tone and texture affect the emotions evoked by his interpretations of the natural world. The nudes and nature scenes in OH! Naturale are response that captures the viewers' attention and helps them discover something new about the subject they think they see.

Moskowitz was born and raised in New York City and moved to Winston-Salem in 1979 after two years in the nation's capital, working at the Washington Post. He spent three years as a reporter and columnist for the Winston-Salem Journal before joining the public relations department at R.J. Reynolds Industries in 1982. His career with Reynolds has included a two-year assignment in Santa Fe, NM, and he is currently director of communications for RAI Services Company.

In his youth and through his teens, Moskowitz channeled his creative energies primarily into writing poetry, music and contemporary folk songs. In 2005, while taking an "Artist's Way" course that he hoped would re-energize his interest in creative writing, he discovered a long-hidden passion for playing with photographic

photography when I'm through," Moskowitz says. "I am not interested in producing pictures that mirror what I see. Rather, I love to layer and alter and play with images - and watch with wonder as the interplay of shape, texture, color and form transforms itself into an emotional vignette that speaks to the viewer in a language beyond words."

Moskowitz is a member of Artworks Gallery, Associated Artists of Winston-Salem and The Muddy River Art Association. His work has appeared in national juried art exhibits and is often displayed in galler-
