Di Mona creates unusual wood sculptures from dead and fallen trees. The beauty and elegance of the knots, inclusions, grain and natural imperfections make the final product a one-of-a-king piece of art.

"When turning a project, I am the mechanic, but God is the designer," Di Mona said. "I rarely have a predetermined vision of the final product."

Di Mona began carving when he was 10 years old, making objects from his grandfather's wine grape boxes. His creations included realistic birds, animals and wood spirits from Basswood.

Di Mona's passion included a stint as a president of the Nature Coast Carving Club of Inverness, FL, and the Hands On WoodTurners Club of Beverly Hills, FL. Additionally, he has shared his craft with
