Sunnell says, "As an acrylic painter, I use loose brush strokes and color that evoke the idea of subjective realism. This refers to the reality inside your mind, perhaps a memory or a feeling. I strive to capture something that just feels good, past or present. My goal is to share my observations of nature with visual clues of light, movements and color."

Sunnell's work recently earned her a First Place award at the 2018 Waterway Art Association Annual Show.

Sunnell is a member of Brunswick Arts Council, Waterway Art Association and Associated Artists of Southport. She is also a licensed landscape architect in North Carolina and Maine.

The Cameron Art Museum in Wilmington, NC, will offer several new exhibitions including: Like and Likeness, on view from Sept. 1 through Oct. 7, 2019; Recovery in Flight: Sculptures of Grainger McKoy, on view from Sept. 29 through Feb. 17, 2019; Along the Eastern Sea Road: Hiroshige's *Fifty-three Stations of the Tōkaidōe*, on view from Sept. 29 through Feb. 17, 2019; and Nearer to Nature, on view from Sept. 29 through Feb. 17, 2019.

The exhibit, Like and Likeness, is a visitor participatory experience and exploration of the human form. CAM visitors can draw using traditional and new media, working from paper on easels and iPads, copying figurative drawings and sculptural works in plaster, marble, and bronze from CAM

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permanent collection.

In the exhibition, Recovery in Flight: Sculptures of Grainger McKoy, visitors will see from the detailed beginnings of the single iconic feather, Grainger McKoy transforms his intricately carved birds into gravity-defying sculptures that play with form and space. McKoy finds the greatest poetry from observation and understanding of the bird's upstroke, or recovery stroke, as he describes, "This motion of the bird is when it is least productive and most vulnerable, yet here can be found a grace and beauty that exist nowhere else."

The renowned South Carolina wood carver and artist grew up in Sumter, SC, and attended Clemson University, earning a degree in zoology, while also studying architecture. After graduating, McKoy apprenticed for eighteen months with the renowned bird carver Gilbert Maggioni in Beaufort, SC. McKoy's work has been exhibited at the High Museum of Art, Brandywine River Museum and Brookgreen Gardens.
