Clemson University in Clemson, SC, is presenting Through the Lens, featuring works by Zane Logan, Haley Floyd and Amber Eckersley, on view in the Sikes Hall Showcase, through Jan. 21, 2020. Please join the artists on September 25th from 3:30 - 4:00pm to learn more about their work through brief presentations and an artist reception

Fall 2019 at Clemson University brings together the work of Zane Logan, Haley Floyd and Amber Eckersley, three South Carolina natives and recent graduates of the Master of Fine Arts program, each with a concentration in photography. Through the Lens presents a frankly straightforward investigation of what it means to be human. Each artist's body of work relates to the other in terms of confrontational storytelling, yet their distinctions are showcased with regard to presentation and approach.

Zane Logan is a faculty member at the Fine Arts Center in Greenville, SC and currently serves as the Southeast Chapter Chair for the Society for Photographic Education. Logan's work comprises a series of ensitively composed portraits. The models look directly into the camera with plaintive honesty that compels the viewer to connect. Far from polished and perfected, there is a raw reality in a diverse array of faces from various ethnicities, ages and genders. Their somber expressions subvert the pretense usually associated with portraiture and underscore apparent physical scars, bruises, plain clothes and unkempt hair. The backgrounds in the pieces are neutral gray and black tones, directing full attention to the penetrating gaze of each model. The lack of identifying information results in a quiet and contemplative collection of work that allows for exploration and revelation in each portrayal.

Logan has exhibited throughout the United States in group and solo shows at venues that that include the Columbia Museum of Art, Redux Contemporary Art Center, Riverworks Gallery, PhotoPlace Gallery, and others. He earned his bachelor's degree from Savannah College of Art and Design.

Haley Floyd is an adjunct lecturer at her undergraduate alma mater, Lander University, in Greenwood, SC. Like Logan's





pieces, Floyd's work possesses a deceptively peaceful probity through the depiction of unaccompanied young children, domestic spaces and landscapes. The photographs are forthright and unvarnished, as the rooms portrayed are cluttered and dimly lit. There is a sense of possible danger to the children as they stand unsupervised and fully vulnerable at the edge of a cracked and empty concrete swimming pool or, clothed in only a diaper, extend a tiny arm through a broken storm door to pet a large dog. The landscapes in this group of pieces are secretive and mysterious. There is a feeling of expectation that invites the viewer to follow a shadowy path in search of a sunlit space that is just out of the line of sight.

Floyd has participated in numerous regional shows including the SPE Southeast Exhibition as well as several group and solo
