

The Stone Center in N. Wilkesboro, NC, Will Hosts the 2019 Wilkes County Quilt Show - Sept. 6-7, 2019

The 2019 Wilkes County Quilt Show: *Love, Laugh, Quilt*, hosted by the members of the Wilkes County Quilt Guild, Inc. will be held Sept. 6 and 7, 2019. Hours are 9am-6pm Fri., Sept. 6 and 9am-4pm, Sat., Sept. 7, 2019. It will be held at The Stone Center, located at 613 Cherry Street in North Wilkesboro, NC. Admission \$5 (12 and under free).

In addition to displaying over 100 traditional, modern, and art quilts, the Guild is also preparing a Bed Turning of vintage quilts that belong to Guild members. A Boutique of dolls, crafts, pillow cases and baskets will also be available for sale and all made by members. Don't forget to buy tickets for the 2019 Raffle Quilt. There will be seven vendors on hand offering a wide range of quilting and sewing supplies. All attending will have the opportunity to win a beautiful raffle quilt.

There will be a daily door prize. (You must be present to win.) Our Grand Prize package is valued at over \$1,000 and is a Janome 2030QDCB sewing machine w/extension table, quilting kit, carrying case and an assortment of fat quarters. This drawing will be Saturday at the end of the show. (You do not need to be present to win the Grand Prize.) For every \$10 you spend in the Boutique or with vendors, another ticket for the Grand Prize will be given. The show is the Guild's largest fundraiser that helps us purchase fabrics that are made into charity quilts for babies, children and veterans.

The HART Theatre in Waynesville, NC, Offers Works by Nina Howard

The HART Theatre in Waynesville, NC, will present an exhibit of works by long time business entrepreneur and artist, Nina Howard, in conjunction with the theatre's production of "Mama Mia" which runs through Sept. 15, 2019.

After recently renovating her new studio at the Biodome in J Creek, Howard prepared for her one-woman exhibit at The HART Theatre.

Howard, a part-time resident of Waynesville since 1987, returned to the mountains full time in 2011 and purchased the defunct Biodome in J Creek, (50' geodesic dome built back in the 80's with the help of John Denver's Windstar Foundation). She renovated it to house her art studio and is having a resurgence of her modern art. Back in the early 90's, Howard owned an art gallery in Waynesville at 33 Church Street, where the Patio Café now resides.

A graduate of FIT in NYC with a degree in Interior Design and the top honor award of her graduating class, Howard also is an entrepreneur in the Spa world, being the founder of Bellanina Day Spa, Bellanina Institute and Bellanina Skin Care line, as well as owning a short term furnished rental

business with 7 locations. She has won 2nd place in the Church Street Art Fair, designed artcards for Folkmoot, and has been represented by galleries in Atlanta, GA, Highlands, NC, Ann Arbor, MI, and New York, NY. Howard has been in many shows over the past 30 years. In 2010, Howard was voted "Best Artist" in the *Current Magazine's Best of Washtenaw* - Readers' Choice Awards (Washtenaw County, Ann Arbor, MI).

Howard shows and sells her work primarily in Ann Arbor, MI, and is an Artist Member of the Haywood County Arts Council, co-sponsor of the art exhibit at HART. You can also make an appointment to visit her art studio in Waynesville to see many of her paintings.

Theatre Art Galleries in High Point, NC, Offers 4th Exhibit Focused on Bicycles

The Theatre Art Galleries (TAG) of High Point, NC, is pleased to announce a Juried Art Exhibit titled *THE BICYCLE: Art Meets Form*, on view through Oct. 4, 2019. A reception will be held on Sept. 5, from 5:30-7:30pm.

This is the fourth year for the exhibit and it will be held in conjunction with the 2019 Bobby Labonte Foundation Charity Bike Ride (<https://bobbylabontefoundation.org/>) in downtown High Point. The exhibit will feature art from almost 50 artists in all media that relates in some way to bicycles or cycling. Prizes will be awarded during a reception on Sept. 5, for First Place: \$500, Second Place: \$250, and Third Place: \$100.

The Hallway Gallery will feature *PRINCESS CURETON: Artistic Metaphor*. This exhibit is based on metaphors that reflect the very personal and spiritual landscape of Cureton's experiences and narrated through the figure in surreal background. Using a variety of processes to coax the figure away from the surface of the canvas such as embedding hair, jute, beads, modeling mediums, hand-made papers, fabric, glass, sand and material indigenous to the spiritual and spatial environment, she attempts the illusion of reality and 3- dimensionality. Her work is an autobiographical reflection of the consonance and dissonance in her life, which Cureton shares openly and honestly

with the viewer.

GreenHill in Greensboro Celebrates 75th Anniversary of World War II

The GreenHill Center for North Carolina Art in Greensboro, NC, presents *What Remains of the Day: Memories of World War II*, a solo exhibition by Chapel Hill-based artist Gesche Würfel exploring the history and memory of World War II and the Holocaust through landscape photography, portraiture, sound, and video, on view from Sept. 20 through Nov. 15, 2019. A reception will be held on Sept. 20, from 6-8pm.

What Remains of the Day: Memories of World War II chronicles certain of the most tragic events of World War II. Würfel, who was born in Germany and now lives in North Carolina states that she hopes her images of places and people encourage viewers "to think about how the horrors of
