The exhibitions are devoted to spotlighting regional artists that reside within specific counties in Southeastern North Carolina. To spotlight new artists, last year's 10:10:10 artists were not eligible for this year's exhibition. Of the 50 artists that submitted portfolios, 10 were selected and will display 10 individual pieces along 10 linear feet creating 10 unique exhibitions in a sole gallery.

There were no limits to the works for the 10-foot space. Mixed mediums were used as vessels to capture varying imaginative and impressive art. The emerging artists were encouraged to include unconventional architectural features presenting a diverse collection.

A wall of quotes from each artist statement will be debuted this year to give insight on the artist's theme and showcased portfolio.

"Whether you call it fluid art, liquid art, or acrylic pouring, there's nothing more satisfying than creating abstract masterpieces by letting pigment run wild," said Andres Ramos Jr., one of the ten artists.

The exhibitions were juried by an Arts Council Committee comprised of specialists in the field of visual arts.

### North Carolina Wesleyan College in Rocky Mount, NC, Features Works by Joseph Bounds

North Carolina Wesleyan College in Rocky Mount, NC, will present *Echoes of Portraiture – Recent Paintings by Joseph Bounds*, on view in the Mims Gallery at NC Wesleyan's Dunn Center, from Sept. 19 through Oct. 27, 2019.

Bounds' oil paintings are not conventional portraits; his portrait subjects seem ethereal in fractured and layered abstract compositions that are carefully executed with delicately modulated tonalities. These images are profoundly psychological, even mystical, with personages appearing to exist simultaneously in the present, past, and future. What one might compare would be a slowly tumbling and rotating freeze-frame hologram.

When one takes in the artist's imaginative approach to the human form and portrait, it is not surprising to find out that Bounds earned his Bachelor of Fine Arts degree at the famous Chicago Art Institute, home to some of America's most unconventional imagist painting since mid century. Home based in North Carolina, Bounds nevertheless exhibits his art internationally from the Saatchi Gallery in London to Limner Gallery in Hudson, NY. He has soloed at the Horace Williams House in Chapel Hill and Studio Oh in Chicago.

In 2018 he took First Place in a competi-

tive exhibition at the Cape Fear Studios and Special Merit in Figurative Art at the LST Gallery on line.

Bounds taught figure drawing in the Barton College Art Department in 2018 where his admirable reputation and artwork caught the interest of Wesleyan's Mims Gallery. We are indeed fortunate to have persuaded Bounds to exhibit with us this season.
