Grovewood Gallery in Asheville, NC, has several art and craft offerings for the month of October, including demonstrations spotlighting local makers in celebration of American Craft Week, which takes place Oct. 5-14, 2018.

On Oct. 5 and 6, from 11am-4pm, metalsmith Audrey Laine Sawyer will be at the gallery selling her wares and demonstrating her process of piercing nature-inspired silhouettes on the face of her hand-fabricated, hollow form jewelry. Sawyer holds a bachelor's degree in studio art from Rollins College and is a 2010 graduate of Haywood Community College's Professional Crafts Program. In addition to her shadowbox earrings, pendants, and rings, she will also showcase jewelry that incorporates lost-wax castings of her own carvings and found objects, such as stag beetles and bird bones.

This site once housed the weaving and woodworking operations of Biltmore Industries, an Arts and Crafts enterprise - originally backed by Edith Vanderbilt - that played a significant role in the Appalachian Craft Revival during the early 20th century.

Today, Grovewood Gallery offers two expansive floors of finely crafted furniture, ceramics, jewelry and more, contributed by over 400 artists and craftspeople from across the United States. The gallery also boasts an outdoor sculpture garden and presents rotating exhibitions throughout the year. Free parking is available on-site.
