Fertel says, "I have been making art my whole life. My earliest collage, created when I was six, was saved by my grandmother and still survives. I have always collected and used recycled materials for my work. Books and paper have become

The arts legacy began with Edwin Voorhees, (1919-1999) known for his NC coastal watercolor seascapes; and Mildred Voorhees (1924-2007) best known for her colorful, patterned watercolors and rich oil still lifes and landscapes.

Edwin had long wanted to host a family art show as a way of gathering the clan and sharing the varied talents of those working in the arts. So, the first Voorhees Family Art Show was held in the family home in Morehead City in 1998. Edwin passed away the next year but the Voorhees Family Art Show continued, moving to Asheville within a few years. It has been hosted in one of several Voorhees family homes in North Asheville ever since. This year's show celebrates the 24th show continuing the Voorhees Family legacy begun by Edwin back in 1998.

Three of Edwin and Mildred's six children and a daughter-in-law will be showing their work at this event: Susan Voorhees, oil and pastel paintings; Jane Voorhees, watercolors, pastels, prints, cards & calendars; David Voorhees, wood-fired stoneware and porcelain pottery; David's wife, Molly Sharp Voorhees, sterling silver and gold jewelry, some incorporating natural beach stones; and David's son-in-law, James Becker, resin-glazed art objects. Also exhibiting are guest artists Chad Alice Hagen, handmade books and walnut ink, Cheryl Stippich, stained glass and polymer clay. tings. All of them, however, have one thing in common: each one is a portrait of the artist herself. It is a project, she explains, that chronicles her journey into midlife, and it began as the ten-year anniversary of her mother's death approached. "This work is an effort to summon her wisdom and guidance from beyond the grave and acknowledges the mysterious presence of absence," she says.

Shae Bishop's garments, some of them painstakingly assembled from hundreds of individual porcelain or stoneware elements, have specific functions, such as the "Swimsuit to Wear While Looking for Hellbenders," or they are meant to invoke particular characters, as in the case of a floral cowboy hat titled "Garden Variety Cowboy." Each of his seven pieces is accompanied by a photograph of the artist modeling the garment (yes, they are wearable), and they represent an impressive fusion of Bishop's love and knowledge of fashion, his sense of design, and his technical skills with ceramic materials.
