## Corrigan Gallery LLC in Charleston, SC, Features Works by Jennie Summerall

Corrigan Gallery LLC in Charleston, SC, will present *Paper Collages*, a solo show by Jennie Summerall, on view from Nov. 5 - 30, 2021. The gallery will open Nov. 5, from noon-7pm, as part of the Charleston Gallery Association Artwalk but in an abbreviated manner. Anyone wishing to meet with Summerall during the show must make an appointment.

Summerall is a local artist and Charleston native who did the ultimate by leaving Charleston for years spent in the Boston area soaking up the history and academic energy and then returning to her roots. She is known for her portraiture, her survey of botanical and floral imagery in the history of art and her paper collages. She has also created many paintings based on mythology.

Collecting papers from many sources she pieces them together to create lovely, whimsical, and often environmental statements. The handmade papers come from all over the world, rooted in ancient craft traditions, and are increasingly hard to find. They offer certain challenges due to the unpredictable nature of their dyes and physical properties.

Summerall's portraits of Seamus Heaney and E. O. Wilson hang at Harvard and the National Portrait Gallery respectively. She maintains a summer studio/gallery in Deer Isle, Maine, when pandemics and family time permit.

The Corrigan Gallery presents art with presence and a future instilled with intellect. An eclectic collection of thoughtful,

provoking works continues to be presented in an intimate space. Bringing a lifetime of Charleston art experience to collectors and presenting artists with decades of creating as well as those in the early years of their careers, the gallery provides a contemporary, local alternative to the traditional southern art scene. The gallery does handle works from the estates of Elizabeth O'Neill Verner and Alfred Hutty and that of other important second market pieces.
