The Columbia Museum of Art in Columbia, SC, is presenting Michael Kenna: Venezia, on view through Jan. 9, 2022. Taken over 20 years, this photographic series is a moody valentine to one of the most miraculous cities on Earth. Venice (Venezia in Italian) is a floating world that sits at the crossroads of the East and West. While there are millions of travel photographs of Venice in existence, artist photographer Michael Kenna infuses his with distinct magic. Prowling the city while it sleeps, he shoots in black and white. His long, extended exposures drink in the electric lights and add a blurry quality at times, capturing the buoyancy of gondolas rocking gently on the water. The North Carolina Museum of Art in Raleigh, NC, is presenting Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau Visionary, on view through Jan. 23, 2022. Czech-born Alphonse Mucha (1860-1939) was one of the most celebrated artists in Paris at the turn of the 20th century. As an influential force behind the art nouveau movement, he created sumptuous posters and advertising materials-promoting such everyday products as cigarette papers and tea biscuits-that transformed the streets of Paris into open-air art exhibitions. Alphonse Mucha: Art Nouveau Visionary celebrates the Mucha Trust Collection's first major US tour in 20 years, featuring a vast array of posters, illustrations, ornamental objects, and rarely seen sculpture, photography, and self-portraits - all showcasing Mucha's distinctive style of harmonious compositions, sinuous forms, organic motifs, and lush color palettes.
