

practice and serves as the impetus for this exhibition. Under the tutelage of Hans Hoffman and with significant influences from Mark Rothko and Arshile Gorky, this painting is a rare example of Kohlmeyer in her artistic adolescence. *Geometry with Feeling* will exhibit *Transitive* alongside more mature examples from the artist's painting and sculptural practices to encourage audiences to think critically about the evolution of the artist's recurring motifs and the refinement of her increasingly postmodern abstraction.

A native of China, Wu immigrated to the US in 1970. She studied Chinese painting and calligraphy in Hong Kong then received her BA in Art History from Salem College in 1996. She also studied Printmaking at WFU as an auditor from 1997-2014. Wu has taught classes and workshops in Chinese art and Printmaking at Salem Community courses, Reynolda House of American Art, and Sawtooth School of Visual Art and has been a member of Artworks Gallery for many years.

Shana Grugan's work is primarily inspired by her coastal surroundings and the many patterns found in nature. She is
