The Yadkin Cultural Arts Center in Yadkinville, NC, will present *Owen Daniels: More Than Just a Picture*, on view from Jan. 4 through Feb. 23, 2024.

Daniels offers the following statement, "My artistic journey is guided by the transformative power of photo manipulation. With each piece I create, I strive to reshape reality and redefine perception. Photo manipulation is my medium of choice, allowing me to traverse the boundaries of imagination and reality, and to craft new narratives from existing visual elements."

"In a world saturated with imagery, I find inspiration in the infinite possibilities hidden within every photograph," adds Daniels. "I believe that reality is not static but can be molded, stretched, and merged to reflect the visions that dwell within the depths of our consciousness."

"My work is a delicate dance between technology and artistry. I employ digital tools to carefully blend and reconfigure photographs, breathing life into scenes and subjects. Through meticulous attention to detail, I aim to create compositions that challenge the viewer's understanding of what is real and what is an illusion," says Daniels.

"My art is a reflection of the everevolving nature of perception in the digital age. It speaks to the malleability of truth and the potential for beauty in the unexpected. I aim to evoke a sense of wonder and curiosity, inviting the audience to question the boundaries of possibility and the essence of our visual experiences."

"As an artist who utilizes photo manipulation, my goal is not to deceive but to inspire. I hope to instigate conversations about the boundaries of creativity, the ethics of image manipulation, and the evolving role of photography in a world where the

lines between reality and art are increasingly blurred."

"Ultimately, my work is a celebration of the power of imagination and the boundless potential of visual storytelling," adds Daniels. "Through photo manipulation, I seek to redefine the limits of our perception and to craft a unique space where reality and dreams merge to form a new and captivating visual language"

Daniels' photographic career started at the US Army Photographic School of Cartography, learning the basics of photography and photo printing. In addition to this formal training, I worked for several years as a freelance photographer and extended my photographic career by fine-turning the art of visual storytelling and developing a distinctive, decisive and intimate photojournalistic signature style which has led to various opportunities that include: Artist in Residences, Public Art Installations, Grants and varied other commissions.

In 2019, Daniels received the Duke Energy Grant and Z Smith Reynolds Lead Artist for the Presence Absence Project awards. He is a visual artist/photographer, educator
