The 2022 Columbia Open Studios tour will feature 42 artist's studios on Apr. 2 & 3, 2022. Explore artwork and artistic practices of area artists while poking around in their studios during the Weekend-long event presented by 701 CCA.

After a two-year hiatus due to COVID-19, 701 Center for Contemporary Art once again welcomes the public to visit local artists during the free, selfguided tour of artist studios in the City of Columbia, and Richland and Lexington Counties. This year's event takes place Saturday, Apr. 2, from 10am-6pm, and Sunday, Apr. 3, from noon-6pm. Columbia Open Studios presents the public with an opportunity to delve into the Columbia region's dynamic arts community. 
