Gritta grew up in Chicago and moved to Asheville in 2005. She has studied at the New York Studio School and holds a BFA from Converse College in Painting and Printmaking. Originally a figurative painter, she has steadily moved towards abstract work, as it gives her the freedom to dive deeper into aspects of the human condition. She paints in a pensive expressive style with a mastery of the interplay of color.

Gritta's work is reminiscent of Richard Diebenkorn's beautiful early Berkeley abstracts which, at times, can be read as landscapes. She has been featured in numerous solo and group exhibitions in North Carolina and the East Coast. Her work is included in many corporate collections in the Carolinas and Boston.

Gritta explains, "On any given day, we are surrounded by the relentless noise of social media. Unseen players offer up a non-stop barrage of words and virtual images from shiny devices of all shapes and sizes, each competing desperately for our attention and presence. Ironically, it is because of these forces that we are losing our ability to truly be present, to pay attention, and to slow down. More than ever before, in these times of dizzying change and chatter, we long for and need a place of quiet and repose".

Emerging artist Moni Hill was born in Berlin and was raised in Ohio. She knew she was destined to be an artist at an early age. In 2004, Hill moved to Asheville with husband and family and began painting in earnest. She has a love of the outdoors and a great respect for Eastern philosophy, which is reflected in her haiku inspired titles, vibrant colors, textured layers, bursts of

energy, and a style uniquely her own.

Hill's upbeat works invite the viewer to pause and experience the energy and balance of the work. Her paintings have been included in numerous solo and group exhibitions throughout NC and can be found in healthcare, education, and business settings.

Hill's work in *Place and Presence*, is inspired by "komorembi", a Japanese term which eloquently captures the effect of sunlight streaming through the trees. She states, "On my daily walks in the forest I am constantly scanning for those moments when the light shines through the trees. As a lover of metaphors, I similarly go through life looking for light shining through moments both grand and mundane. I am drawn to visual proof of life's wear and tear, ups and downs, triumphs and failures and our attempts to recover".
