His photographic career started at the US Army Photographic School of Cartography, learning the basics of photography and photo printing. In addition to his formal training, he continues to work as a freelance photographer with a distinctive and intimate photojournalistic signature

Francis Marion University in Florence, SC, Offers Works by Megan Mosholder

Francis Marion University in Florence, SC, is presenting *Megan Mosholder: Vertically Challenged*, on view in the newly named Steven F. Gately Gallery (formerly University Place Gallery), through Apr. 22, 2022.


Mosholder pushes the boundaries of painting and reacts to the social-political landscape through site-responsive installations. Her three-dimensional drawings, often enhanced by light, emphasize obscured elements within recognizable places correlating symbolism with lived experience.

In July 2020, Mosholder had her leg amputated. This surgery was one of over 30 surgeries that she has endured since a catastrophic car accident in 2018, where she was trapped inside her burning car. The result of this accident changed the installation artist's life forever. Mosholder currently relies on a wheelchair for long distances and a crew of assistants to help her build her larger-than-life installations. Due to her mobility issues, she has had the opportunity to see the world from a new vantage point.

Vertically Challenged was conceptualized while Mosholder was stuck in bed recovering from her amputation. This exhibition challenges the viewer to see the world the way she sees it from her wheelchair.

The Vertically Challenged exhibition is largely composed of a site specific installation which has been crafted specially for the gallery, keeping in mind the intricacies of the architectural and aesthetic space. The exhibition also includes medium scale sculptures.

A graduate of Savannah College of Art and Design with an MFA in painting, Mosholder boasts numerous awards from institutions such as the Foundation for Contemporary Arts and the Hambidge Center for Creative Arts and Sciences. She is often

commissioned by leading corporations such as Google, and is included in public art programs, museum exhibitions, and art fairs. Interest in her installations have led to international projects, evidenced by her inclusion within the European Cultural Centre's 2022 Personal Structures exhibition presented during the Venice Biennale and a public art space in Sydney, Australia (2017). These works speak to the power of site-specific work to make a lasting impression upon the viewer.

Mosholder continues to create installations that relay her devotion to her work and the communities she engages. Currently, she resides in Atlanta, GA, is a Professor at Kennesaw State University and has worked as a full-time professional artist for seven years.

Wilmington Art Association Offers Annual Show During 2022 NC Azalea Festival


