The Charleston Artist Guild in Charleston, SC, is pleased to present *The American Landscape*, an exhibition featuring paintings by Peter Finger, on view in the Guild Gallery, from Apr. 1 - 30, 2022. A reception will be held during the First Friday Art Walk on Apr. 1, from 5-8pm.

Finger paints primarily in both oils and acrylic mediums. He grew up in the shadows of the Catskill Mountains in Upstate New York. He started painting in his teens and was influenced by the artists of the Hudson River School who painted the wild landscapes of New England in the early 19th Century. Finger would trace the steps of these romantic painters and create his own interpretation of the scenes.

While studying fine art and art education in college, Finger would continue his Catskill Mountain journeys, now armed with a camera. Photography soon played a critical role in his development as an
