The College of Charleston in Charleston, SC, will present two new exhibitions including: Teach Me A Song, featuring works by Elisa Harkins and Meshes of Resistance, featuring works by Spandita Malik, both on view in the Halsey Institute galleries and Hill Exhibition Gallery, from Apr. 5 through July 20, 2024. A reception will be held on Apr. 5, from 6:30-8pm. The reception is free for C of C community + members, \$5 donation otherwise. Elisa Harkins's ongoing project, Teach Me a Song, builds on the artist's interests in translation, language preservation, and Indigenous musicology. With the recordings of these songs - which may be ceremonial, religious, rock & roll, electronic, etc. - Harkins' practice of nation to nation sharing and trading music is presented as a means of decolonizing traditions of Indigenous musicology. This exhibition is the first time the entirety of this project has been exhibited. Teach Me a Song is organized in collaboration with the Crisp-Ellert Art Museum at Flagler College in St. Augustine, FL, and The New Gallery at Austin Peay State University in Clarksville, TN. Harkins is a Native American (Cherokee/

Harkins uses the Cherokee and Mvskoke languages, electronic music, sculpture, and the body as her tools. Harkins received a BA from Columbia College, Chicago and an MFA from CALARTS. She has since continued her education at the Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture. She has exhibited her work at Crystal Bridges, documenta 14, The Hammer Museum, The Heard Museum, and Vancouver Art Gallery. Harkins created an online Indigenous concert series called 6 Moons, and pub-
