American Folk Art & Framing in Asheville, NC, will present WATER: Beautiful, Powerful, Shimmering, on view from June 3 - 24, 2021.

The artists represented at American Folk Art all find inspiration from water, and create using their own affinities to it in myriad creative and personal ways.

"I delight in finding the commonalities in our artists' works, and all the different angles from which they view their lives. Identifying a common theme emerging from their hearts is so much more inspired that asking an artist to paint to a chosen subject matter," says Betsey-Rose Weiss, gallery owner.

Water references in the bible, in dream states, the sudden nostalgia evoked from noticing a water tower, to a walk in the rain or a moment of lakeside revelry... Water is us; it has permeated our consciousness and the imagery we create. Water gives us life, but we must also respect the power of its currents and tides. This dichotomy lends a certain drama and reverence to the way in which we depict the brilliant surfaces and mysterious depths of water.
