

munity of potters. They fire some or all of their work in wood fire kilns.

Some of the potters can trace their family history back hundreds of years to farmers who used the local clay to craft wares from clay. Some learned the craft by apprenticing with local potters. Others have been drawn to the community after studying in faraway places like Estonia and Japan; or at Alfred College in New York and the High Mowing School in New Hampshire; or closer-by at East Carolina University and NC State University. They continue to learn from and support one another as artists.
