Art & Light in Greenville, SC, will present Ordinary Instant, featuring works based on her reflection on a Joan Didion quote about an ordinary instant, by artist, Eva Magill Oliver, on view from June 28 through July 30, 2022. A reception will be held on July 1, from 6-8pm to celebrate the opening with beverages served in the courtyard.

A few months ago, Magill Oliver came across a quote by American author Joan Didion from her memoir "The Year of Magical Thinking." It reads, "Life changes in an instant. The ordinary instant." Magill Oliver sat with the weight of these words for quite awhile and held their significance close as she created the works for this show.

These pieces are a reflection of her now very raw awareness of the meaning of Didion's words. Her interpretation of

the quote is split between two paths of thought. The first, and more direct path, is just how fragile and fleeting life can be. How in an instant all you think and understand can become unhinged. The second is how life itself is made up of an infinite amount of ordinary instants that when added up ultimately shape and mold our entire lives. These small moments might seem insignificant but in truth encompass the beauty of our existence.

Magill Oliver's art for this show attempts to convey this duality of thought. To begin to understand these 'ordinary instant' moments will ultimately help us begin to understand what it means to be human. Connect and heal us.
